Thank you for your patient prayer as we have made some significant transitions during the past two months. We were very glad to get our feet back on to U.S. soil, reaching our final destination (Boise, Idaho) December 9th. Now, after enjoying our extended Christmas-time holiday with family, we've been settling in to re-learning our home culture while confirming our roles of involvement for the coming home-assignment year.

Our physical needs are well cared for, as we live with a daughter and have the use of a donated minivan. Through the month of March we are taking on some teaching roles in our sending church, while networking with other Boise-area fellowships. A number of these collaborate in a three week valley-wide missions conference beginning February 20th. There will be seven other missionaries partnering with us in this, representing practically all the continents of the world!

We think of Ireland often, and have been encouraged to learn of the life being expressed through Nenagh Baptist Church (The Hatchery) and our Irish partners Matt and Jules Tuttlebee. Recently, Matt's email described how 'A young man was talking with me for about 3 hours yesterday afternoon and says he will come on Sunday. Pray for as he is really searching and is disillusioned with many aspects of his upbringing. very open.' Also this past Thursday during the weekly 'drop in' coffee morning, over 40 people participated and a Haiti collection for disaster relief totaled almost 400 euro (\$600).
